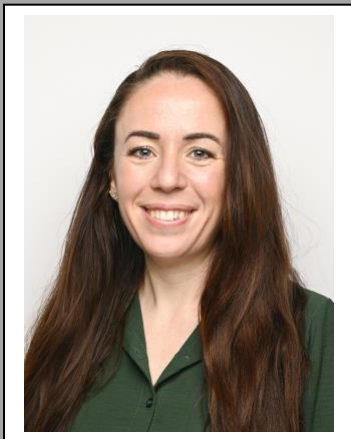
We hope this curriculum guide helps to clarify many of the questions and concerns pertaining to Year 3 academic issues at GEMS Cambridge International School, Dubai.

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SECTION 1: SCHOOL INFORMATION

INTRODUCTION

Cambridge International School (CIS-DXB) offers the internationally recognised National Curriculum for England and prepares students to take the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) courses, the Advanced Subsidiary (AS) and A Level Examinations of the Universities of Cambridge and London (UK), consistently producing results well above the UK national average, year after year. The school is an approved center for the University of Cambridge Local Examinations Syndicate and for London University.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Extra-Curricular Activities (ECAs) take place during the school day once a week where students have the opportunity to select from a range of clubs in which they wish to join. School teams and clubs are established in basketball, football, cricket, badminton, swimming, athletics, Eco, Arabic, French and ELL (English Language Learners). Clubs include and are not limited to: performing arts, art and craft, public speaking, clay modelling, performing poetry, gardening, jewellery making, debate, henna designing are also offered to engage the interest and enthusiasm of all students. We also offer a range of after-school clubs delivered by additional providers (sometimes at a cost) to further improve the enrichment opportunities for our students. We have recently introduced the 'Junior Duke' initiative into our Primary department and over 120 of our students last year, completed the programme developing skills to last a lifetime. The same programme will be available to students this year.

TEXTBOOKS

At Cambridge International School, we plan and deliver creative, engaging lessons across all areas of the National Curriculum for England. In the Primary School, we do not use textbooks in the large majority of our subjects, including English and Science. Instead, in line with best UK practice, our students access hands-on, innovative, experiential learning experiences to enable the best possible learning outcomes. Research shows that students learn best and retain knowledge best through experiences and opportunities to apply skills and learning. As adults, when we encounter a problem in the 'real-world' we do not pull out our old school text book to find the answer. We use our skills, experiences, critical thinking, communication, collaboration, problem solving skills and emotional intelligence to solve them. Textbooks are provided for Maths lessons and lesson PPTs are also uploaded to Phoenix Classroom for reference at home, should a parent wish to revise/re-cap a lesson/concept.

ONLINE PLATFORMS

At CIS we recognise the important role that technology plays in the learning process and in society today. With technology advancing at an incredible rate and pace, it is essential that we provide our students with the digital literacy and skills necessary to thrive in the ever-changing world in which we find ourselves in. We use a number of different online platforms in school and for homework purposes. If you have purchased the 'Tool Kit', your child will soon come home with log-in credentials for the following websites:

- **CENTURY (Maths-English-Science)-** This programme uses artificial intelligence to create a bespoke learning pathway for your child. It identifies gaps in their learning or areas for improvement and uses their strengths to support these areas for development. It provides teachers with detailed feedback on your child's level of attainment and where they need further support. For further information about how CENTURY works, click this [link](#).
- **TimesTablesRockStars (Maths)-** This platform is specifically designed to improve student's times tables and division facts and recall. It aims to improve their 'fluency' in Maths, aiding their mental arithmetic skills and strategies and overall levels of confidence. It is a National Curriculum requirement that all students, by the end of Year 4 are fluent in the 12 times tables and this programme supports and enhances it. Students love the competitive and interactive nature in which they take place in 'Rock Battles' earning coins to spend in the online store. For more information about TTRS click this [link](#).
- **Destiny Discover (Reading)-** When COVID-19 restrictions resulted in schools not being able to send books home, CIS Dubai invested heavily into an online reading platform which ensured that our students are able to access a range of books online. Destiny Discover allows students to read books online, at the same time, free from harm and the possibility of spreading on germs.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE (BYOD)

Students in Primary bring their own devices to and from school each day. Devices do not replace pencils, pens or paper but assist with learning in a variety of ways and are used to supplement teaching and learning. Students complete their own research, complete quizzes providing teachers with immediate feedback on their levels of understanding and many more. We strongly recommend that i-pads are your choice of device due to the versatility and high functioning capabilities of the device and also their ability to quickly scan and process QR codes. Please ensure that your child's device has a protective cover and case to ensure that it is not become damaged.

SCHOOL BUS SERVICE:

At CIS Dubai, STS are the bus company and provider that bring a large number of our students to and from school each day. Students travel under the supervision of bus assistants and teachers in an environment monitored closely by CCTV. HOMEWORK:

Research does not actually show a strong positive correlation between homework completion and academic progress. Research does however show that the completion of homework can improve a student's independent learning skills, self-regulation, independence, accountability and organisational skills. At CIS Dubai, in the Primary department, homework is optional. The reason for this is because our students have a very long and intense school day and we feel that it is important for them to relax and unwind at home, to re-charge ready for school the next day. We do however understand that many parents wish for their children to complete additional learning at home so we do provide

weekly homework. We strongly encourage homework completion in Year 5 and Year 6 so that students can best prepare for their transition to Year 7 where homework must be complete.

EATING ARRANGEMENTS:

Students have 2 eating times during the day at 9:30am and 1:00pm. Most students bring a packed lunch which is eaten in class but students do have the opportunity to visit the school canteen (during the morning break only) to purchase food.

SECTION 2: THE CURRICULUM

THE NATIONAL CURRICULUM FOR ENGLAND:

The National Curriculum for England (NCfE) is often described as a 'Spiral Curriculum' as concepts are constantly revisited and reinforced throughout a child's school years to scaffold and build upon learning. A full copy of the NCfE can be found by clicking this [link](#). By using the contents page you will be able to explore each subject in greater depth to see the curriculum requirements. We appreciate that this is a lot to absorb but parents are supported at the beginning of each half-term with 'Topic Webs' which identify which curriculum objectives will be taught that half-term.

THEMATIC CURRICULUM APPROACH:

The students in the Primary department at CIS Dubai access a thematic curriculum with NCfE objectives and the Positive Education Enhanced Curriculum objectives intertwined within subjects. This means that each half-term, students are immersed in a topic for a period of approximately 6 weeks with all learning linked to this topic as much

as possible. This allows for students to become more engaged and it helps them to transfer their learning to other subject areas within the curriculum. The half-term begins with a 'Sensational Start' and ends with a 'Fabulous Finish' to engage students as much as possible and to help to celebrate their learning at the end of the topic.

TOPIC WEBS & KNOWLEDGE ORGANISERS:

These two documents are sent to parents at the start of each half-term to inform them about the curriculum objectives that will be covered over the course of the up and coming weeks. Topic webs provide information about which curriculum objectives will be covered along with key and important dates. Knowledge Organisers provide parents and students with visuals and information about key concepts to support and reinforce learning.

TRIPS/THEME DAYS:

Trips and educational visits are planned throughout the school year to improve the enrichment opportunities available for our students and to provide students with the opportunity to apply their learning beyond the classroom. Trips are communicated well in advance and for paid trips, parents will need to complete payment using the online parent portal. It is vital that parents complete the consent form and payment form to prevent students from not being able to access any trips/visits. Theme days are also planned to the school calendar to celebrate learning and to further promote enrichment within our curriculum.

SECTION 3: ASSESSMENT

Assessment Background

Assessment is an integral part of Teaching and Learning and is required to optimise all students' learning by providing teachers with a picture of their progress and achievements and to identify the next steps to success.

At CIS we continually assess the students learning on a daily basis through: observations, informal progress checks, in class quizzes, end of term assessments and more formal examinations such as the GL Progress Tests. All students at the start of each year have baseline assessments so that teachers are provided with information of each student's starting points to enable them to plan lessons and activities specific to their individual needs and to monitor progress throughout the year.

For the informal assessments, we do not inform parents about these dates as we do not wish to place stress or pressure on our students. Instead, we aim to attain an accurate picture of each child's level of understanding at any given moment in time. Not what they have managed to learn for a test only to forget it the next day.

For formal assessments such as the GL Progress Tests we will provide you with the dates of these exams and with revision notes to support your child at home. In school we will start to prepare for these examinations too by introducing the students to the types and styles of questions that they will encounter.

Please note: We do not provide test materials to revise for in advance of an assessment nor do we provide parents with their child's test paper after the assessment.

Assessment Calendar

At the end of each term, reviews of topic and concepts that have been taught and in class assessments take place to monitor and track each child's progress.

Standardised assessments take place at the following times of year, in school only:

The above assessments are international benchmark assessments and can only be sat in school.

CAT4- Cognitive Abilities Test- Is similar to an IQ test and provides the school with information about your child's preferred learning styles to that we can provide stimulating lessons, catered to their specific, individual needs. For more information about CAT4 tests, click this [link](#).

NGRT- New Group Reading Test- Provides the school with information relating to your child's reading ability.

GL Progress Tests for Maths, English and Science- Provides the school with information relating to your child's levels of attainment linked to English National Curriculum Standards. For more information about GL Progress Tests click this [link](#).

All of the above formal, informal, formative and summative assessments, along with teacher judgement feeds into the formation of end of term reports.

SECTION 4: REPORTING

Reporting Overview

At CIS Dubai, formal reports to parents are sent at 3 times during the year. Parents are also invited to 3 formal Parent Teacher Meetings during which you can meet with your child's teachers, be informed about their levels of progress and attainment and learn more about how you can support your child with their next-steps linked to learning.

Parents are able to contact their child's class teacher at any time for a short informal overview of their child's progress but more detailed and formal reporting is saved for the reports and meetings so that teacher's time is best managed planning exciting and engaging lessons for your children.
