I write this to reach out to the CIS community to walk with us in the same way. In everything we do, we leave an emotional footprint and without us walking with visible intent, we can easily lose our way. Finally, as we begin this new term and New Year, I encourage all of us to embrace all that life offers. Let your knowledge, understanding and character be your foundation, and let your imagination be your guide and inspiration.
